GENERAL CONDITIONS BOARDING SCHOOL 2022-2023

Preamble

The present General Conditions regulate all contractual aspects between the parents of our students and the Collège et Lycée Saint-Charles. They mention the conditions of admission for boarders from the Jura, Switzerland, the European Union and outside the European Union, the fees, the communication modalities and the data protection rules. The various school regulations - general regulations, boarding regulations and dress code - are available on the website and during the admission interview.

1. Admission

In order to be admitted to the Collège et Lycée Saint-Charles, you must complete the ad hoc application form and send it to the Collège administration.

An interview with the admissions committee is required and the final registration is validated by the payment of the admission fee. Siblings' discounts do not apply to registration fees.

The admission fee amounts to CHF 3'000 and covers the administrative costs of admission and is not refundable. Any other or further compensation for breach of contract is expressly reserved.

Students are admitted to the Collège et Lycée Saint-Charles boarding school from the age of 10. A student enrolled at Collège et Lycée Saint-Charles will not be allowed to live independently.

2. Visas and residence permits in Switzerland

Pupils can only attend classes if and as long as they have the necessary permits and visas. On the administrative side, the Collège et Lycée Saint-Charles takes care of the residence permit for all students on the basis of documents provided by the legal representatives. The residence permit is recognised in all countries of the Schengen area.

However, we kindly ask parents to apply for a student visa (for non-European students only) after receiving the documents from Collège et Lycée Saint-Charles. The latter declines all responsibility in the event of late arrival due to problems with visas or other documents required for the student's entry into Switzerland. In this case, the first term's fees are due.

The following documents must be presented to the Swiss embassy or consulate in the country of origin, translated into English or a Swiss national language.

School certificate;

Student's motivation letter;

Birth certificate or family book;

Copy of passport;

Proof of parents' financial resources;

Swiss settlement permit issued by the Swiss embassy or consulate in the country of origin;

Form of commitment to leave Switzerland at the end of the studies (available at the embassy);

Each non-European student must be announced by his/her parents to the embassy of the country of origin in Switzerland.

Switzerland does not require a visa for a number of countries, a list of which can be found on the Swiss government website (https://www.sem.admin.ch/sem/fr/home/publiservice/weisungen-kreisschreiben/visa/liste1_staatsangehoerigkeit.html).

For pupils from these countries, including all European Union countries, the documents below should be sent directly to the school, which will take care of the procedures with the population service of the Canton of Jura.

VAT is charged in all cases where it applies.

4. Separately invoiced academic services

The official language of instruction is French. English is taught in all grades and is also the language of instruction in the bilingual lycée structure and in the international section. The official languages of the curriculum are French, English, German, Italian and Spanish in the lycée. Other languages outside the official curriculum can be taught outside the school. Group lesson rates apply from 4 or more students; below 3 students, the course does not open or will be charged at the price of a semi-private or private course.

Additional courses in FLE (French as a foreign language) and AEL (English as an additional language) are charged extra. Courses are set up for a minimum group of four students; below four participants, the course is charged at the semi-private or private rate. FLE/AEL courses may be made compulsory if the minimum level required to follow the course is not reached. In all cases, parents are informed.

Language examination preparation courses and examination fees

Fees for language exam preparation courses will be charged by the semester.

There are also additional fees for examinations such as Cambridge, Goethe, Celi.

The registration fees for the ECS end-of-compulsory-schools exams (Swiss Catholic Schools) and the Matura exams are included in the general fee.

5. Books and school supplies

Textbooks are available for loan in the compulsory school, for purchase in the lycée and in the international section. Books and exercise books as well as basic school supplies are included in the boarding fee. Licences for the use of digital textbooks are charged. Replacement of lost or damaged books and school supplies will be charged.

6. Cultural and academic activities

Boarding fees cover lectures and cultural outings such as: theatre, concerts, academic excursions. Trips abroad may be an integral part of the academic programme and additional fees will apply. These fees will be communicated to parents in advance on the relevant registration form. All registrations are final and non-refundable.

7. Sports and entertainment

The boarding fees also cover sports and entertainment: in-house sports activities, local sports clubs, entry to local sports facilities excluding fitness membership, weekend activities as listed at the beginning of the school year.

8. Computer equipment

Each student may need a computer, PC or MAC, compatible with the Office 365 suite, provided by the school. Wireless network connections are available in the school. The school provides a full range of computer equipment in classrooms, study rooms and computer rooms. When computer equipment is loaned to a student, he/she is responsible for it. In the event of damage, theft or loss of such equipment, a charge will be made.

9. Insurance

Health and accident insurance: these are compulsory in Switzerland for all students. The Collège et Lycée Saint-Charles organises the insurance and invoices the parents for the costs. Students who have a certificate of insurance from a company based in Switzerland and offering the necessary guarantees must present it at the time of registration. Their insurance card must be presented on arrival at the Collège.

As the insurance rates are annual and depend on the decisions of the competent federal authorities, an estimate of the costs is invoiced before the beginning of the school year, and a statement of account is drawn up afterwards.

Students will be charged for medical and nursing expenses.

11. Family discounts

Children in the same family benefit from the following reductions:

- •2nd child: 10% on the school fees, boarding and accomodation
- •3rd child: 15% on school fees, boarding and accomodation

No reduction on other invoiced items.

12. Communication

For ecological reasons, Collège et Lycée Saint-Charles prefers to communicate electronically. By signing these Terms and Conditions, you automatically agree to receive all correspondence by e-mail. If you do not wish to do so, please put your e-mail address in brackets on the registration form.

13. Agreement to use photos for marketing and documentation of the school

For promotional and marketing purposes, Collège et Lycée Saint-Charles produces and distributes promotional material on a regular basis. School events are highlighted on our Facebook page and on social networks. If you do not wish your child to appear on these publications, please indicate this explicitly on the registration form.

14. Data protection

The Collège et Lycée Saint-Charles respects Swiss legislation on the protection of personal data. Anyone can access, modify or delete their data at any time, especially when leaving the school.

All personal data collected by the Collège et Lycée Saint-Charles during registration is used for admission, administrative management of their studies and possibly boarding at the Collège et Lycée Saint-Charles, as well as for other services offered to students.

Collège et Lycée Saint-Charles may, under certain conditions, pass on personal data to other school stakeholders to whom it subcontracts services (kitchen, travel partners and extracurricular camp organisers).

15. Billing

Invoices for school fees, board and lodging and insurance are issued annually. Invoices are payable in advance, before the start of the course. It is possible to request a half-yearly invoice. Any additional costs not included will be invoiced separately twice a year. Cash payments are not accepted.

In case of arrival or change during the year, the school fees will be charged on a pro rata basis from the first day of the month.

16. Payment deadlines

Invoices must be paid within 30 days of invoicing; the currency is the Swiss franc (CHF).

After this period, interest on arrears of 1% per month will be charged. Administrative and reminder costs are charged for late payment:

1^{er} reminder: CHF 20.00
 2^e reminders: CHF 50.00
 3^e reminders: CHF 100.00

No reservation of places can be made until the admission fee has been paid. Any complaint concerning invoices must be sent by post to the College within 30 days of their issue.

Pupils will not be allowed to attend classes until the invoiced fees have been paid.

17. Cancellation, change of status, notification, return and related costs

For new students:

If the registration is cancelled before 30 June, a cancellation fee equivalent to two months' tuition and boarding will be charged.

A cancellation fee equivalent to three months' tuition and boarding will be charged if the registration is cancelled after 30 June.

<u>For current students</u>:

If a student withdraws before the end of the school year, all fees for the current term and the following term are due.

Any boarding student who transfers to the day school is subject to the same conditions.

Unless parents give written notice before 31 March, pupils are tacitly enrolled for the following school year. If the tacit re-enrolment is cancelled after 31 March, the school fees for the first three months will be due as compensation.

In the event of a student's dismissal, all fees for the current semester are due.

18. Registration for the following school year

Parents are required to complete the re-enrolment form by 28 February. If a student withdraws after 28 February, the first three months' school fees will be due as compensation.

19. Student absences

From the fourth consecutive week of absence with good reason, a reduction in boarding fees will be granted.

No further reductions are made on school fees or other taxes.

20. Pocket money

Weekly pocket money deposited with the accounts department may be distributed to students by the College accounts department or by the boarding prefects. It is recommended that reasonable amounts are used and that pocket money is adapted to the age of the children. The school does not encourage access to free bank accounts or additional funds. In exceptional circumstances, and if parents wish the College to distribute additional pocket money, parents must deposit the amount in an account with the accounts department.

21. Code of conduct and school rules (dress code, drugs, alcohol, individual respect)

The school's codes of conduct and rules are available on the website and form an integral part of the General Conditions. Failure to comply with the codes of conduct will lead to disciplinary action. In the event of a serious breach of this contract or of the codes of conduct in force, the student may be expelled with immediate effect.

By signing, parents agree that the school may test their child for the use of alcohol and non-prescribed drugs. Parents hereby acknowledge that any student who provides, possesses or tests positive for non-prescription drugs or drugs will be required to leave the school with expulsion penalties.

22. Personal effects

The school strongly discourages students from bringing high-value items such as branded clothing, watches or jewellery to school. The management accepts no responsibility for unmarked items and/or valuables that are not deposited with the boarding school officials.

23. Change in financial conditions

Upon acceptance, these financial conditions apply to all pupils admitted for the current school year, regardless of the edition of the financial conditions initially signed by the parents. The present edition of the financial conditions applies automatically to all parents. They can be sent to them on request to the secretariat.

24. Applicable law and place of jurisdiction

Swiss law shall be the only law applicable to the relationship arising from this contract, regardless of the domicile of the parents or legal representatives. The domicile and place of jurisdiction for all difficulties that may arise in connection with this contract is the Canton of Jura and the district of Ajoie, Porrentruy.
